For the essays, the area he can work on is the formatting even in the rough draft stage. He tends to submit one very long paragraph rather than separate paragraphs for the introduction, body paragraphs, and conclusion. Using the different outline options should assist him in developing each paragraph prior to making the rough draft. He's able to include relevant supporting details, but structuring the content in the paragraph format will be beneficial.

For the creative writing, this is where he flourished. He was able to include all the elements needed for a complete story (background/setting, rising action/plot, climax, falling action, and the resolution). His is able to use different literary devices to share and this was also present in the personal narrative. However, he can also work on adding more content in the story to better develop the plot.

The main grammar area he needs to focus on are perspective (first, second, and third person). He had a good understanding of grammar mechanics (punctuation placement, subject-verb agreement, compound nouns, and tenses).
