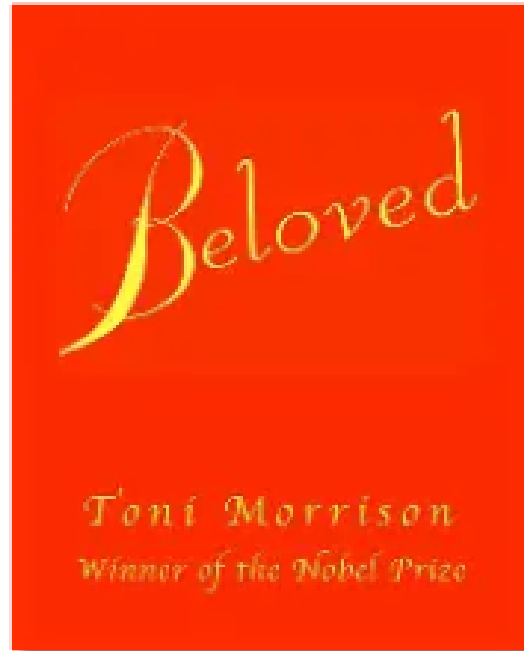

About the Text

Beloved tells the story of Sethe, a formerly enslaved woman living in Ohio after escaping slavery. When a mysterious young woman named Beloved enters her life, Sethe is forced to confront painful memories she has tried to forget.

The novel explores how trauma, memory, and history shape identity. Through Sethe's experiences, readers see how the past continues to impact the present and how healing requires facing difficult truths.

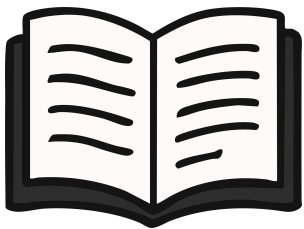

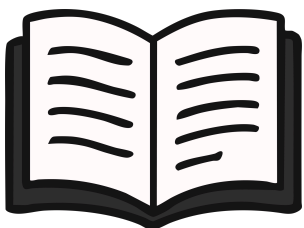
